South Mornington Junior Football Club is a sporting club that facilitates a safe learning environment, that develops the Peninsula's junior athletes to reach their highest potential, a club that is diverse and inclusive to those that wish to become part of a local organisation.



FEES & JUMPER LEVY



The MPJFL & AFL South East use the PlayHQ registration system. There are 3 parts to your registration fee. The initial payment of \$110 goes directly to the MPJFL & AFL South East and covers a variety of expenses like League administration fees and League Best & Fairest nights.

There are also expenses that the club will need to cover and this is broken into 2 parts. Part 1 is \$75 and covers medical & umpiring fees. Part 2 covers things like new footballs for training & new teams, updating training equipment like tackle pads & bibs, covering Coaching and Trainers accreditation courses (first aid/CPR courses), milestone, game day, participation and Best & Fairest trophies, electricity expenses, cleaning products, printing costs, ground markings, pizza nights, skill sessions/programs for players & coaches and other incidentals.

A one-off \$50 Jumper Levy is payable at time of first registration to SMJFC. The club Treasurer will email you with the club's bank details so that payment can be made. The jumper levy is used as security for the game day jumper supplied to your child for the season. The levy will be refunded when your child finishes playing at South Mornington JFC. If the supplied game day jumper is lost the \$50 will be retained by the club to cover the cost of the lost jumper and a further \$50 will be required as security for the replacement jumper.

Jumpers are to be returned to the Team Manager after the last game of the year. Please make sure you bring a T-shirt or jumper for your child(ren) to put on after their last game so that the game day jumper can be handed in.

CODES OF CONDUCT



MORNINGTON PENINSULA JUNIOR FOOTBALL LEAGUE PLAYER AND OFFICIALS CODE OF CONDUCT

MPJFL Players and Official Code of Conduct is in place to ensure football is a positive and enjoyable for everyone. All players are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct.

Each Player and Official must:

- a) Not bring the game of Australian Football, the AFL, or the League or the Club into disrepute;
- b) Participate in Competition Matches in accordance with the Laws of Australian Football;
- c) Respect the spirit of the Laws of Australian Football and fair play, and behave accordingly;
- d) Display and foster respect for Umpires, opponents, Coaches, administrators, Officials, parents and spectators;
- e) Never argue with or dispute a decision of an Official or Umpire. If a Participant disagrees with a decision, they should deal with their dispute in accordance with the relevant Rules, Regulations, Policies and Determinations;
- f) Control their emotions, and not engage in verbal abuse of or swearing at or in the vicinity of others, sledging Players and/or Coaches or behaviour that deliberately distracts or provokes an opponent;
- g) Comply with the AFL and MPJJFL Rules and Regulations including the National Member Protection Policy, the League By-Laws and this Code of Conduct;
- h) Never engage in any type of violence either on or off the field;
- i) Contribute to a safe sporting environment and respectful culture which is accepting of individual differences, and behave accordingly;
- j) Cooperate with their Club Officials, Coaches and team-mates;
- k) Participate for their own enjoyment and benefit and for the enjoyment and benefit of their teammates, Coaches and Club Officials;
- l) Comply with and observe the AFL Vilification and Discrimination Policy including respecting the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, sexual orientation, cultural background or religion;
- m) Not engage in conduct that is, unethical, unbecoming or likely to cause harm to the reputation of the Participant or the Club;
- n) Not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media;
- o) Not make or post inappropriate, offensive or discriminatory comments in public, including via social media, about Players, Clubs, Umpires, Officials, the AFL, or the League. Social media includes, but is not limited to, email, instant messaging, text messages, phone messages, digital images, website postings (including social media such as, but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, websites and blogs) and;
- p) Use appropriately the facilities and equipment made available for administration, coaching, training, Competition Matches and events, including facilities provided by the opposing teams;

CODES OF CONDUCT



MORNINGTON PENINSULA JUNIOR FOOTBALL LEAGUE PARENT & SPECTATORS CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct aims to provide a safe environment for participation. Aggressive, threatening or other inappropriate behaviour by members, their families, their friends, and other sporting personnel while attending a game or event will not be tolerated.

Each Parent and Supporter must:

- a) Support the participants and enjoy the Match;
- b) Encourage participation, but don't force it;
- c) Teach that enjoyment is more important than winning;
- d) Not ridicule mistakes or losses;
- e) Lead by example and respect all Players, Coaches, Umpires, Officials and spectators. Physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated;
- f) Recognise all volunteers who give up their valuable time;
- g) Not publicly criticise Umpires and instead raise personal concerns with Club Officials in private;
- h) Do not use remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability as many such comments are politically incorrect and it is your Coach, team-mates, Club and family that are let down with such remarks;
- i) Respect the facilities and equipment of their own and opposing Clubs;
- j) Not engage in physical and/or verbal intimidation, abuse or conduct toward any Player, Official, Umpire or supporter;
- k) Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, Coaches, Officials or Players;
- l) Not to enter the field of play in any sanctioned Competition Match unless granted permission by an Official to do so;
- m) Not take part in any form of bullying including via the use of social media;
- n) Not make or post inappropriate, offensive or discriminatory comments in public, including via social media, about Players, Clubs, Umpires, Officials, the AFL, or the League. Social media includes, but is not limited to, email, instant messaging, text messages, phone messages, digital images, website postings (including but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, websites and blogs).

Non-Compliance

Parents or others found to have behaved inappropriately, and who are associate members or have agreed to abide by our club's Code of Behaviour and this policy, may face disciplinary action as outlined in our Member Protection Policy.

The South Mornington Junior Football Club is committed to maintaining an environment that promotes racial and religious tolerance, prohibits inappropriate conduct, and provides redress for victims of discrimination. We expect all players, officials, and parents to display professional conduct at all times, avoiding offensive remarks related to religion, culture, sex, or race.

Safeguarding Children and Young People Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct has a specific focus on safeguarding children and young people at South Mornington Junior Football Club (SMJFC) against sexual, physical, psychological and emotional abuse or neglect.

It is intended to complement other codes of conduct, club policies and legislation, and works hand in hand with the current AFL, and MPJFL rules and regulations around all things Child Safety.

The Victorian Government introduced new improved Child Safety Standards for implementation from 1 July 2022. The Standards are compulsory, minimum standard of safety in all organisations providing services to children.

South Mornington Junior Football Club (SMFJC) is strongly committed to complying with all requirements and promoting best practice in child safety procedures and policies.

The purpose of this Code of Conduct is to establish clear expectations for appropriate behaviour by adults towards children and young people. It aims to protect children and reduce any opportunity of abuse or harm to children.

This Code of Conduct applies to all committee members, club officials, volunteers, participants and contractors engaged by, and in association with, the South Mornington Junior Football Club (SMJFC). Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct will be considered a breach of the Policy and may result in investigation, disciplinary action including restriction, suspension or termination.

U8 & U9: NEW & FIRST YEAR FAMILIES



With all new U8 & U9 teams we need a group of volunteers to get the team up and running.

For your child's team to run successfully week to week, you will need to fill the official game day roles of a coach, assistant coach, team manager & trainer x 2.

PLAYING ATTIRE & CLUB MERCHANDISE



PLAYING ATTIRE:

Players **MUST** wear league approved attire. League approved attire consists of a club game day jumper (club provides this after the \$50 jumper levy has been received), club shorts and club socks (available to purchase through the club on merchandise days/nights). Football boots must be worn and can be purchased at sporting goods stores.

Players/parents are required to keep a clean and properly maintained jumper for the duration of the season and then return it to the Team Manager after the last game as per the Jumper Policy.

OPTIONAL EXTRAS:

Above knee black or skin-coloured skins can be worn under playing shorts. A long sleeve skins top may be worn. No long sleeve normal tops are to be worn; it **MUST** be skins/compression material so that the material is not loose. These can be purchased at a reasonable price at Big W, Best & Less or Kmart and also at sporting stores.

CLUB MERCHANDISE:

The club sells a variety of club merchandise from personalised hoodies, caps, bucket hats, football bags, tops, jackets, umbrellas, stubby holders etc. These can be purchased on merchandise days/nights & can be ordered online from our website.

MOUTHGUARDS:

Mouthguards are **COMPULSARY** on gameday (players are not allowed to play without a mouthguard - please ensure your child has one in for every game) and we encourage players to wear them at training also. The club will hold 2 x mouthguard fitting dates held at the club for those who would like a professional one. These are done by Diamond Dentures.

PLEASE NOTE:

Club gameday jumpers must **NOT BE WORN AT TRAINING**. If they are damaged at training, there is no time to replace them before gameday. We have training tops that can be purchased for training.



PARENT REGISTRATION & WWCC



All parents MUST be registered on PlayHQ as volunteers. This is now a requirement of the MPJFL & AFLSE due to Child Safety laws. You must also hold a WWCC that is valid for the entirety of the season (until Aug 30th 2025) and volunteer checks can be applied for online for free if you don't already have one. They take approx. 4 weeks to receive. To apply for one, please go to:

The clubs Child Safety Officer will be checking all WWCC cards validity. If you do not hold a WWCC and register as a volunteer on PlayHQ, you will not be able to be added to the teams rotational parent roster or help in any capacity and this will make it very difficult for your Team Manager to manage throughout the season. All parents need to be registered & have a WWCC so that the kids can get out on the ground each week. No exemptions are made to this.

TEAM COMMUNICATION & SOCIAL MEDIA



SMJFC uses Stack TeamApp for club communication. We communicate all club information via the app including upcoming events, important news and general news. Team fixtures, results and ladders can also be located here.

Coaches may use this app to communicate to their families and upload Match Reports and information regarding training and other important information related to your team. If you do not have Stack Team App, please download the app (it is free), create an account, search for 'South Mornington JFC' and request access to your child/ren's team(s) (request access to each child's team if you have children in multiple teams).

If you do have Team App, a new request to your team every year is necessary. If you haven't done so yet please request access. We will use this app throughout the season and after the season for any communication so please make sure you have the app and the correct teams added, as you will miss important information relating to your child's team if you don't.

Most teams use WhatsApp for parent communication. This includes posting weekly gameday rosters, gameday info, changes to training etc. Your child's Team Manager will send you a link to join the necessary group.

We also have a Facebook & Instagram page. Please give them a like/follow and engage with our posts. It helps more than you know.

We also utilize a weekly newsletter during the season to keep you up to date with all things SMJFC, be sure to keep an eye on your email. If you not getting it, let us know!

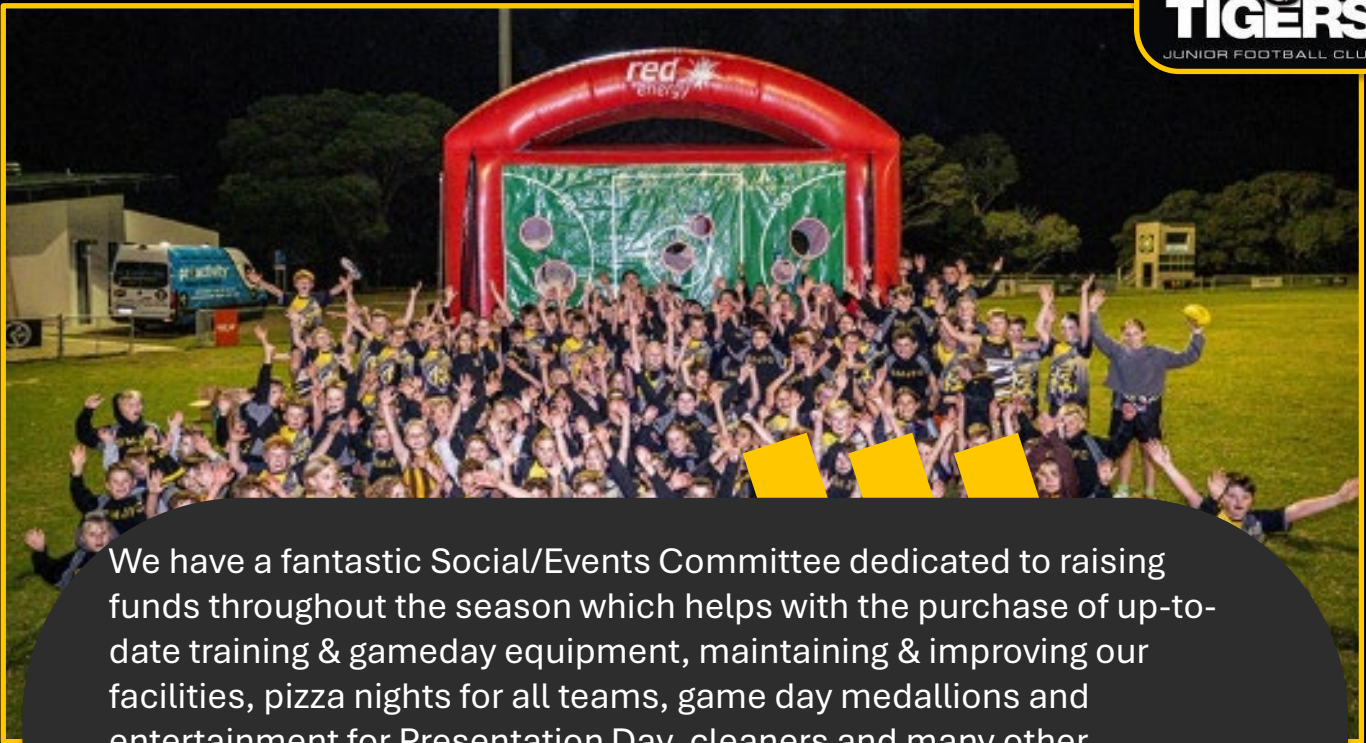

INSURANCE & AMBULANCE COVER



All registered players & volunteers, with up-to-date fees, are covered while engaging in training and official games. It is essential that all injuries are reported to your Trainer or Team Manager as soon as practical during or after training or matches so this can be passed on to the Head Trainer. All incidents are to be reported (for the purpose of impending insurance claims).

For your own protection it is recommend that any family with junior sport participants ensure they have AMBULANCE MEMBERSHIP cover. Accidents/injuries can happen even at training, so it is highly recommended all players have a membership in case an Ambulance needs to be called.

On home game days we engage the services of Medical Edge for medical assistance (if required) and for peace of mind for parents & trainers.
